### Equity & Financial Assistance at Mount George Public School

I want to touch upon the importance of accessibility in education, particularly regarding excursion costs. At the heart of our efforts is my strong belief that public education should be accessible to everyone, regardless of financial means. We handle all requests for partial and full supplementation with the utmost level of confidentiality and I am very cognisant that every family's circumstance is different. Please know that there is no judgement by myself or the school if people need a hand. Money is tough - I get it!

**School and Community Charter:** One thing I really value is working closely with our parents and community and I am committed to work to create positive environments for students, staff, and the entire school community that support student learning. The best education happens when students, parents and schools work together which allows us to strive to ensure that every student is known, valued, and cared for. Our staff will find a time to talk to you when they can give you their full attention. Please remember that while our staff are in class or dealing with other matters, they may not be available to answer your questions immediately.

In all workplaces, people have the right to feel respected. Unacceptable and offensive behaviour has no place in our school community. If you are emailing or messaging a teacher directly, please be mindful of their right to disengage with their work outside of general school hours and focus on their personal and family life. This involves being considerate of time and being careful with the language you select in written communication.

Thanks for your anticipated support in ensuring we work together to maintain respectful relationships that are formed for the benefit of all students in the school.
