Two weeks to go until our big day and preparations are in full swing! 250 engraved pavers will be laid next **Tuesday 23<sup>rd</sup> August 7am-12pm** during our working bee. We have had great interest in our 100 year celebration and Back to Mount George Festival. All indications suggest we will have over 200 people attend our special 100 year ceremony and between 500-1000 visitors to our beautiful school on the day.
