### **Principal's Report:**

What a busy term it is shaping up to be as we find ourselves already at the end of Week 3! As announced last term, Mr Smith is continuing this Semester as our Willow Class teacher and Ms Richardson has resumed her role as Teacher Librarian plus teacher release, kitchen gardening, and COVID-19 additional tuition.

#### Scope of Works

In the coming months, our school will continue to undergo construction works to make our school accessible and wheelchair-friendly. There will be various stages of the works where areas of our school will be cut off to allow sub-contractors to perform their duties. The children's safety is paramount and we have numerous management strategies in place to mitigate any risks posed:

<u>Out-of-Bounds areas</u> – It is even more pertinent now that students adhere to the 'out-of-bounds' rules, with construction workers and machinery on-site most days. Students are only to enter out-of-bounds areas during break times with permission from teaching staff.

<u>Class time</u> - Students needing to move around the school during class time are only to do so with a 'buddy' or with staff.

#### **Learning Conversations meeting**

A big thank you to all parents who joined in our parent-student meetings for Term 3. Once again, we will have had participation from 100% of our school families and this really shows how well our students are supported in their learning goals and progress. All of the children really enjoyed reviewing their achievements and sharing their work with family and have been actively involved in setting goals for this term.

#### Zone shotput

Following on from last term's Small Schools Athletics Carnival, not just one but two of our students qualified to compete at the Zone Athletics Carnival held at Tuncurry in Week 1 – Shayla Boorer and Caitlin Hardgrave. Caitlin was able to attend and achieved 7<sup>th</sup> place against students from all over our zone! Well done to both girls for their efforts and congratulations on such fantastic results!

#### Primary School Maths Comp - Challenging young minds since 1981

Year 5 and Year 6 students from across regional NSW have the opportunity to test their numeracy and problem-solving skills in one of Australia's longest running annual mathematics competitions. The competition is now in its 40<sup>th</sup> year and continues to grow each year, attracting almost 17,500 students from 294 schools. The top performing students in each region are invited to our annual awards presentation where they can celebrate their achievements with their family. This year, the competition will be run during Week 6 on Thursday 19<sup>th</sup> or Friday 20<sup>th</sup> August.

#### <u>Home Reading Program – Home Reading Rock Garden</u>

Well done to all children and parents who are reading at home. Parents, if your child has been reading and you have forgotten to record it, just go back and backfill the dates they have read. If you have lost or misplaced the Home Reading Log, or if you would like some extra reading resources for your children to read at home. please contact the school as we have lots of books for all reading levels to lend out to families. It's fun and it is something we can all achieve!

#### **Library:**

Our students have the benefit of an up-to-date library full of new and diverse mixed-media resources. It might be smaller than some, but it is jam-packed with age-appropriate resources and will soon include the first book in the latest series from popular Australian author, Anh Do. We already have some Anh Do fans amongst our students and his new book, *An Unexpected Hero: Pow Pow Pig 1* is sure to introduce a new group of readers to this genre.






