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Principal's Report:

Welcome back and Thank You for your Home Learning efforts: We welcome back all of our students after 4 weeks of learning from home. I really want to thank them all for their resilience and commitment to their home learning. Of course, all of the effort and support that students received from their families during this period ensured that they were still connected to their learning. So, I acknowledge the parents, grandparents, and family members who all provided support. Finally, the efforts, diligence, and professional care that all of our staff have put in over this period has been second to none. Our school is so very lucky to have the staff we have. Their ability to work collaboratively and flexibly, particularly during these very unusual times and with very little notice, makes me feel so very proud of our school team. Messages that I have received from our community recently, very much support this thinking. Whilst we are only back for one week before the school holidays, the teachers have planned some additional activities for our children to assist them in reconnecting with their friends and face-to-face learning. <u>Current Restrictions</u>: Our school has now been placed on Level 3 restrictions in regard to the pandemic which means, in summary:

- Students are now learning at school.
- No non-essential visitors inside the school
- QR Codes are in place for all adults going into a school including all staff and contractors, who must check in and out along with signing normal attendance books.
- Mask-wearing for all staff and secondary students from Year 7 up. We ask all parents entering Mount George Public School to wear a mask.
- *** Students and staff with any flu like symptoms should not attend school, self-isolate, and have a COVID test and return when they receive a negative test result.

<u>Please return all School Laptops and chargers</u>: Our school was happy that we could provide laptops to families who needed them and should we go into lockdown again we will do the same.

Excellence in NSW public schools is supported by the external validation process. Once during a School Excellence cycle, schools undergo an external validation of the evidence of their school self-assessment which, in turn, supports the development of the Strategic Improvement Plan (SIP). External validation provides an opportunity for schools to discuss their judgements about the school's practice, and the evidence that underpins them, with a panel of peers. An external validation process provides an assurance to the school and to the system that the progress being made aligns with the expectations articulated in the School Excellence Framework.

<u>Outstanding NAPLAN Results</u>: Congratulations to all of the students who completed the NAPLAN assessments this year in Reading, Writing, Spelling, Grammar & Punctuation, and Numeracy. The results are out and our students performed exceptionally! All of our year 5 students achieved fantastic growth compared to their year 3 assessment and we had a number of students achieving the top bands in multiple areas. Very proud of all of our students!

<u>SAS Recognition Week:</u> Last week was SAS recognition week and Mount George Public is so lucky to have such an excellent group of support staff in our school. Other school news:

<u>FRRR Vouchers</u>: The Foundation for Rural and Regional Renewal (FRRR), in partnership with First Steps Count Inc., is supporting children to access quality educational experiences by providing \$50 gift vouchers which are redeemable for items necessary to continue successfully with the school year, such as clothing, shoes, school bags, stationery items, lunchboxes, water bottles, etc. This program has been funded by various organisations, trusts, and foundations whose generosity has been the financial backbone of this program.


